galleries & public art

LCC's main campus and downtown campus are both overflowing with public art. You can see sculptures and murals by internationally renowned artists, talented local artists, and LCC alums. And the collection is only growing, as they added three new murals in 2022.

Lane's Art Galleries offer a rich and diverse cultural experience. Visitors can have the transformative opportunity to experience life as depicted by regional, national, and international artists. Exhibits are inclusive of a variety of media and concepts. Located in building 11 on the main campus, the galleries include two adjacent exhibit spaces, the Roger Hall Gallery and the Main Art Gallery. The galleries are open Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. during the regular academic year (closed Summer term and other breaks). Admission is free.

Lane's Art Gallery is home to Oregon's first Art-o-mat, a retired vintage cigarette machine converted to vend small works of original art. The pocket-sized artworks range from small paintings, sculptures, poems, or concept-driven pieces. All artworks cost \$5.
